From the Pastor's Pen

On Wednesday, we once again enter into the season of Lent. St. Francis de Sales said that Lent is the autumn of the spiritual life since during that time through greater spiritual intensity, we reap a harvest to help sustain us for the rest of the year.

On Ash Wednesday, Mass and distribution of Ashes will be at 6:30 A.M., 8:30 A.M. (School Mass), 5:30 P.M. and 7:30 P.M. At Noon there will be a Liturgy of the Word with distribution of Ashes.

Ash Wednesday (February 26) and Good Friday (April 10) are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs but they together should not equal another full meal.

The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The obligation to abstain from meat commences at fourteen (14) years of age. The obligation to fast commences at eighteen (18) years of age and ends at fifty-nine (59) years of age.

Although the faithful enjoy freedom in conscience to excuse themselves for a just cause from these mitigated laws of fast and abstinence, the obligation to do penance is a serious one. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation in the Lenten season.

On Yom Kippur, Jews take no food or drink from sundown to sundown. During the month of Ramadan, Muslims take no food or drink from sunrise to sunset. During Lent Orthodox Christians go vegan. By comparison, our communal practice of fasting (two days) and abstinence (eight days) seems rather tame.

It is important not only to remember what we do during Lent, but also why we do it. The reasons are many. They include, but are not limited to the following: We seek to grow in interior freedom, we do penance for our sins, we strive to create a space for God to work in our hearts (through prayer), in our finances (through almsgiving) and even in our stomachs (through fasting or whatever else we may give up). The point is not to try to earn God's love. God already loves us. The goal is to respond in love to God who first loved us.

There are many special activities throughout the Lenten season. These include:

*Stations of the Cross which will be prayed every Friday at 9:00 AM, 2:15 PM and 7:00



*Every Thursday evening at 6:00 P.M., we will pray Evening Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours. This takes about ten minutes and all are welcome. After Evening Prayer, the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available until 7:00.

*Our annual Soup and Speaker Series on Wednesday nights at 6:00 PM continues this year but with a twist. Rather than speakers, we are going to be participating in the *Best Lent Ever* program from Dynamic Catholic. Please come and join us.

*In addition to the 8:30 Mass Monday through Saturday. Mass will also be offered at 6:30 AM Tuesday through Friday (Thursday morning Mass is an addition for

*Our Parish Lenten Penance service will be on Sunday March 29 at 7:00 PM.

*Friday April 3 will mark another Forgiveness Friday. From 9:00 AM to 9:00 PM at least one priest will be available for confession all day long.

*This is in addition to our regular confession times of 8:00 to 8:20 AM Tuesday and Wednesday, as well as from 3:00 to 4:15 on Saturdays. Priests are also available for confession by appointment.

Ash Wednesday also marks the 21st anniversary of Eucharistic Adoration at St. Therese. This has taken place on five days and week and now includes a sixth day: Saturdays from 9:00 to 1:00. This Lent consider spending some refreshing quiet time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. In addition to Saturday, the chapel is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 AM to 11:00 PM Monday through Friday. Visitors are always welcome to drop in. WONDER ABOUT THE TRADITION OF THE ST. JOSEPH'S TABLE??

The tradition began years ago, when farmers wished for relief from a great famine in the country of Italy and prayed to St. Joseph, asking for his intercession. A table was displayed as an expression of gratitude to St. Joseph for his help in alleviating the famine that took many lives. This tradition of the St. Joseph Table began back in the Middle Ages, but here at St. Therese, this annual event began more than 30 years ago with several families serving as role models for those that would keep the tradition alive.

Through the years, the event has changed and evolved – starting in the old church/school (a building that no longer exists) and now displayed in our Gathering Space. The table has been set in several different designs and heights, not to mention spaces, like the old school, new school and Wooldridge Center, but regardless of the shape or location, the main focus is always the food that is placed on the table – breads in the shapes of Catholic symbols, cakes shaped like fish, crosses and lambs and a multitude of cookies iced in pastels and bright colors of all sizes, the beauty of flowers that enhance the table, and bottles of wine. Also included on the table are three place settings, symbolizing the Holy Family. Many details go into this project and we hope that you will choose to participate. Sign up forms will be in the pews soon. Our greatest need is for baked goods, so if you can't be here to help, we can always use your cooking skills. 

LIBRARY COLUMN



"A man can derive more profit in a year from Thomas Aquinas's books than from pondering all his life the teaching of others." --Pope John XXII

When we open St. Thomas Aquinas' massive Summa Theologica or another of his works, we're quickly overwhelmed and even lost.

If we find him hard to read, how can we even begin to "think like Aquinas"?
