## From the Pastor's Pen

The events of the past week and the weeks before have been unprecedented. I never thought I would ever see Masses being cancelled like this.

Sometimes we choose our own program for Lent and sometimes a program is chosen for us. The Coronavirus pandemic is a Lenten program that has been thrust upon us and that will continue it seems, for some time. Lent is a type of desert and that is what we are journeying through now.

For the sake of the common good and out of respect for human life, Bishop Johnston, has cancelled all public Masses, both weekday and Sunday Masses, through at the minimum, Friday, April 3. In compliance with civil authorities, there are not to be gatherings of more than fifty people and there are recommendations that they be no more than ten people at a time.

Confessions will continue at the regularly scheduled times including 6:00 PM on Thursday evenings in Lent, but the celebration of evening prayer is cancelled.

The parish communal penance service on Sunday, March 29 is cancelled, but we will still offer Forgiveness Friday with Confessions from 9AM to 9PM, on Friday, April 3.

Also cancelled are: Stations of the Cross and the Wednesday night Lenten Soup/Small Groups, the St. Joseph Table and Living Rosary. We hope to have a blessing of the unborn and their parents in the future.

Our Wednesday night Religious Education, EDGE, and Sunday School programs, as well as our Sunday night LifeTeen are all presently suspended.

Liturgy of the Hours, Stations of the Cross, in-person Bible study groups, and all parish prayer groups are suspended until the public celebration of Mass resumes, as are all parish meetings, including those for Welcome/Christ Renews His Parish.

The Men's Welcome/Christ Renews His Parish retreat is being postponed until June 13 and 14. The Women's retreat is scheduled for the last weekend in April and we will wait before making a decision to have it or postpone it to a later time.

Baptisms will still be celebrated but with attendance limited to immediate family and godparents, all of whom must be symptom free and in good health.

We are exploring ways to stay in touch with you through social media. If you are reading this bulletin column, it is most likely on-line.

I am writing this on Monday and the changes have been happening so quickly that I don't know what the situation will be like when you read this.

Please know that your priests will continue to offer daily private Masses remembering all of you in prayer even though you cannot be present.

Sometimes you may not realize the value of something until it is taken away. That can be the case here. The highlight of my week is the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist and spending time with all of you. This is a heavy cross we must bear but we do so together and we remain spiritually united in prayer even when we are physically apart. Think about how wonderful it will be when we will be able to gather together once more to share in the Eucharist.

At a time like this we have to pray more and not less. There are options for Mass on television and we are exploring a way to provide a video recording of Mass, at least on Sundays from our parish. We will do the same with the Stations of the Cross.

Presently, the church will remain open daily until 6:00 PM. For the time being the Adoration Chapel remains open but there is no exposition. That means that people may come and go as they please. Kindly remember that the chapel is a small, contained space and while we are working to keep it sanitary, I encourage all at risk people, including the sick and all those over 70 to continue their prayer at home.

Despite all this, we strive to continue to serve you and ask for your assistance both spiritual and financial through this difficult time. We still have bills to pay and continue to depend on your generosity even when Mass is not offered publically. Please consider mailing your support to the Parish

Everyone is also encouraged to celebrate Sunday as a domestic church by taking time to pray together as a household. At our diocesan website: [www.kcsj catholic.org](http://www.kcsj catholic.org) there will be some additional links to making a Spiritual Communion, praying the rosary, Chaplet of Divine Mercy, and particularly our recommended Prayer to Mary, Health of the Sick.

*Under your protection, we seek refuge, Holy Mother of God. Do not disdain the entreaties of we who are in trial, but deliver us from every danger, O glorious and blessed Virgin. Amen.*

What we are experiencing is unprecedented. May we bear this heavy cross together lifting each other up in prayer. Please especially pray for the elderly in care facilities who are not allowed visitors at this time. Thank you for being part of our parish.

## FR. KLEINE'S KORNER

During this incredibly difficult and trying time, I wanted to take a moment to provide some means that may be of spiritual assistance to all of you, especially as this situation suspends so many of our acts of public prayer and sacraments.

Additionally, I would encourage you to look to the live streaming of Masses and prayer made available through EWTN and Catholic Radio, so that you may still participate in the liturgical worship of our Lord. There can be a temptation for anger or despair at not being able to participate in the Mass, or being able to receive our Lord. My encouragement would be to treat these absences not as a loss but as an offering. Make them be a willed prayer gifted to God. Use the time and opportunities for rosaries, spiritual readings, time with the family, etc. Don't let the isolation and distance be purposeless, let it be an intentional offering of love.

"Dear Lord, if I could receive you today, I would. If I could go to Mass, I would. If I could be in community with others pray-

ing the stations, or the rosary, or being in CHRP, or Serra Club, or any other activity, I would.

But I cannot.

Please help me to do what I can to continue my devotion and love to you with what is available to me, and help me to receive your grace and love in these trying times, and help make it be a spiritual communion with our Lord, so that the fire of our love for Him doesn't extinguish with distance and separation, but grows all the hungrier. That way, when we can finally go back to Him, to receive Him, He finds us eagerly and lovingly waiting.

Prayer of Spiritual Communion:

*My Jesus,*

*I believe that You*

*are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.*

*I love You above all things,*

*and I desire to receive You into my soul.*

*Since I cannot at this moment*

*receive You sacramentally,*

*come at least spiritually into my heart.*

*I embrace You as if You were already there*

*and unite myself wholly to You.*

*Never permit me to be separated from You.*

*Amen.*

Finally, since we are separated from the community of our Church, seek to make acts of prayer that bind us together spiritually, and that keep the wellbeing and care of others in the forefront of our thoughts and deeds, especially when we cannot physically be there to care for them.

Finally, I provide another perspective on how to make this trying time a means to draw closer to God, and to come through this pandemic and Lent loving Him more fervently than we did when it started.
