#### FR. KLEINE'S KORNER

When I was but a lad in the yonder days of old, I sought to master the skill of swimming in water that exceeded a depth of a foot. For some strange reason, my mother thought that this skill might be helpful to know, especially with our frequent visits to the swimming pool or our family trips kayaking. To this day I've yet to understand the logic behind her reasoning. Regardless, thus began the swimming lessons throughout the summer that my siblings and I all went through.

These swimming lessons also entailed learning how to properly dive off the diving board.

As this wasn't a necessity to complete the swimming lessons, and as many kids did not want to suffer the agonizing pain of belly flops into the pool, several students opted not to try.

My brother and I would have been among those students.

Except my mother wanted us to at least try to succeed in this endeavor. She wanted us to be able to swim as best as we could, so that we could enjoy going to the pool and going kayaking to the utmost. Originally, my brother and I were not keen on the idea of trying to learn how to properly dive off the diving board, due to the aforementioned pain of belly flopping that would result if we failed. However, our mother had the perfect incentive for us aspiring young lads to enkindle within us the courage to face this challenge head on without wavering!

If my brother and I succeeded in our endeavor to properly dive off the diving board, we would be gifted with the greatest of treasures, cards for the Pokemon trading card game bought by our mother.

So my brother and I put on our bravest faces, climbed the steps of the diving board, walked to the edge, and like Aragorn King of Arnor before us, said to our friends and family,

We proceeded to belly flop multiple times before any kind of success was reached.

We currently our facing our set of challenges during this pandemic, challenges that can – like diving of the diving board – seem insurmountable, and even come with them great pain and suffering. It is in the midst of these frustrations, anger, and despair that our Lord implores us to go to our Mother Mary.

Our Lord gifted to us His Mother as our own. Just as He entrusted Himself and His mission to her, from His Incarnation to His Crucifixion to His Resurrection and Ascension, so too does He implore us to give our Blessed Mother that same level of trust. Our Mother lovingly participated fully in Christ's salvific mission, and she lovingly watched over and aided the apostles as they went out into the world proclaiming the Good News of our Resurrected Lord. As she did for them, so too does she desire to aid us.

All that Mary is and does was first gifted to her by our Lord, and all that she desires is to help lead us to better know, trust, and love our Lord. True Marian devotion begins and ends with God, and her great privilege and mission is to help us entrust ourselves fully to our Lord, especially in times of great suffering and sorrow, just as she did at the foot of the Cross.

So as we face our own diving board challenges in our lives that can intimidate us with their seemingly overwhelming fear, frustration, or despair, let us turn to the side of the pool, look to our Mother for loving guidance, encouragement, and aid, and so empowered by the graces from God she mediates for us, climb to the edge of that board and utter the words that our Blessed Mother did before us when she accepted her mission as Mother of God,

"For Charizard."


