**Xavier Schmidt** continues his college studies at Conception Seminary College.


**Bobby McCoy** is our new seminarian and he will begin as a transfer student attending the college program at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St. Louis.

#### A Special Request from our Food Pantry

Our St. Vincent DePaul Food Pantry continues to provide food necessities to over 250 families in our community each month. Over the last two years we have moved toward providing more healthy, fresh food choices for all pantry clients. We ensure that eggs, milk, and most recently a larger supply and selection of fresh produce, are available for each family visiting the pantry.

This obviously requires added refrigerator (not freezer) space, but we have filled all available floor space with previously donated refrigerators and freezers. We have found that one commercial two-door refrigerator has between 45-50 cubic feet of refrigerator (only) space which is more than three times the space available in one standard residential refrigerator. This commercial unit takes up less floor space than two of our current refrigerators and consumes less than half the energy of four refrigerators currently holding this volume of fresh food.

In the past, many of you have stepped up with direct donations of refrigerators and/or freezers when our pantry was in need and for that we remain extremely thankful. At this time, we have a similar need as described above, but the solution is different:

To take the next step, we must replace two of our existing refrigerators (one has already failed and is too expensive to repair) with a high-capacity, high-efficiency commercial unit which has a \$2,500 price tag.

In the long run, we need to replace most of our residential refrigerators in this way. This, as stated, will increase our refrigerator storage space and reduce electrical consumption but, more importantly, allows us to provide a larger, more nutritious selection of fresh food for our pantry clients.

We ask that you consider a cash donation to St. Vincent DePaul, earmarked for this use. May God bless you for your continued support of our SVdP ministry.

#### FR. KLEINE'S KORNER

The Bible is the greatest love story ever told.

In second place is *The Princess Bride*, which holds the silver medal handily and without contention.

Third place belongs to *Die Hard*.

Fourth place goes to the anime *Fullmetal Alchemist Brotherhood*.

And in a respectable fifth place is *It's A Wonderful Life*.

But the Bible reigns as king of this mountain top. For in the Bible we have unveiled for us the unreserved constancy of God's salvific love to humanity throughout human history since the beginning of time and creation. Through Sacred Scripture we bear witness to our Lord's unsurpassable love for humanity, as He unceasingly bequeaths His love to an ungrateful and routinely sinful people. Then our Lord surpasses our expectations by loving humanity so much that He Himself becomes man, and dies a criminal's death for our sake. This profound act of love finds its culmination in our Lord's Resurrection and Ascension, and His institution of the Church, tasking His newly ordained priests the Apostles to go and spread the faith to the world, that all may come to know and love Him.

Yet the Bible is not solely a historical work. It is not limited or bound to the past. Wonderfully, Sacred Scripture is the Living Word. Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ speaks to us in the present day through the proclamation of those past accountings. Through the words of the Bible, we hear He who is the Word. Our Lord speaks to us, as a friend, as one who has loved us from the beginning, and wants us to live in that love.

Yet for many of us, the reading of the Bible is such a dreary or daunting undertaking that we never get through it. Some try to read the Bible from start to end, beginning with Genesis. But by the time they reach the Book of Numbers or Leviticus, or get to King David's 151 Psalms, the more technical

legalistic speak or unfamiliar prose or difficult passages become too great an obstacle to overcome, and thus their journey into Scripture ends.

Others attempt to start with the Gospels, yet they treat their prayerful reading as one would an Olympic race, seeking to rush through it or to complete it in a set number of days. In doing so, they fail to take the time to properly listen to our Lord and become frustrated with their lack of results.

To that end, I present the instruction that my spiritual director gave me.

Start with one of the Gospels. Which of the four is up to you.

And then set out to read each and every day.

However, do not set for yourself a goal of reading a certain number of pages or chapters each day. Nor set for yourself a time limit of reading the Bible for x many minutes each day.

Rather, each day, begin reading your selected Gospel, and when you are struck by a word or phrase, cease reading. This word or verse could come to you after two chapters, or it may be the very first you read. Whenever this movement within you occurs, stop your reading, and rest in prayer with the words that moved you. Reflect on them, pray on them, and ask the Lord to speak to you through them. After praying on these words for many minutes, write down what came to you through this prayerful reading and reflection in a prayer journal.

Then the next day, pick up where you left off until you are once again struck by the words of our Lord, and repeat the process until you have read through all the four gospels and all the letters of the New Testament.

Treat reading the Bible not as a job or a race, but as a chance to take time out of your day to speak to and listen to a good friend. The best friend any of us could have.

Our Lord Jesus Christ.
