Since established, we have educated over two-thousand children ages six weeks to five years in a Catholic Christian manner, Parishioners and Non-Parishioners. St. Therese Early Education Center (EEC) believes that children are capable of learning at an early age. Our mission is to challenge young children to reach their highest potential with the goal to provide a nurturing Catholic education that promotes lifelong learning in a safe, loving, and developmentally appropriate manner.

Cyber Integrity for our Children: Avoiding the Trap of Pornography

Cyber Safety is something we value at St. Therese. All school age parents are warmly invited to attend a presentation dedicated to Cyber Integrity and protecting children from falling into the trap of pornography.

This parent education session will be this Thursday, September 12 at 6:30 P.M. in Good Shepherd Hall. Presenters from The Center for Healing will hold a panel discussion for parents to educate, address concerns, and open up a discussion on media addiction, pornography, and similar topics to help parents brainstorm ideas to keep their homes safe. The goal is to equip parents to have the necessary conversations with their children on these topics and to help parents to set up their home with a culture of openness and connection. Although much of the material is geared toward the parents of middle school children, parents of younger children will also find this information valuable and are very welcome to attend. This is an event for adults only; children should not attend. Parents who attend will be given a non-uniform pass for their students.

Altar & Rosary

The Rosary Making Ministry is a part of the Altar and Rosary Society here at St. Therese. Starting kits and instructions are provided when you first join our ministry. You are on your own to make rosaries at your own pace. Supplies are available in the Parish Office and in the Gift Shop, where finished rosaries can also be dropped off. For the calendar year 2018, we made over 3,400 rosaries - 3,320 went to the Franciscan Mission Warehouse in Independence where they were then shipped to missions in other countries and 80 went to St. Therese School, where they are used in a weekly rosary prayer group. Some of the children take them home after using them. We made 40+ kits for the first grade Religious Ed students and helped them make their own rosaries. Rosaries are also provided for the men/ women purse project. Thus far in 2019, we have made over 2,000 rosaries. The majority continue to go to missions through the Franciscan Mission Warehouse.

FR. KLEINE'S KORNER

I like to listen to J-Pop.

For those who don't know, J-Pop is Japanese Pop Music. While I'm sure it's widely broadcasted across Japan's radio and various music sites on the internet, my primary (and really only) exposure to J-Pop comes from the opening title sequences of the animes I watch (i.e. Fullmetal Alchemist, My Hero Academia, etc). As anime is so widespread in Japan, many musicians will showcase their latest pieces through anime as the show's theme song.

And they're catchy!

True, I don't speak or read Japanese, so without subtitles I don't know what they're saying, but the songs themselves tend to be pretty good. The bands and artists seem to take their spots in animes as a means to not only advertise their work but also compete with the rest. So you'll get pieces that range from loud and bombastic to solemn and melancholic to heart racing action driven to quiet and melodious.

I find myself listening to them often, even apart from the shows themselves.

I'm sure we all know songs like that, catchy songs that stick in our heads. We all know those tunes that, like ear worms (KAHN!), when we hear a single verse or melody hummed we immediately have the entire song stuck in our heads, whether we want them there or not. The removal of these hymns from our minds can often be a herculean task. Even more frustrating is when we successfully exorcise the songs from our minds, only for someone to hum a verse once more, and the whole process starts all over again.

In a lot of ways, I attribute my own priestly calling from our Lord to these lasting melodies. Our Lord's vocation for me was something I would seek to exorcise from my mind. Throughout my time at Benedictine College, someone or something would cause the "song" of priestly discernment to melodiously play through my mind, much to my ire. I went through all four years of college casting aside this call. I wanted to make my own way, my own happiness. It wasn't until

I was holding my diploma in my hands that the catchy tune became a full blown kick in the pants from On High and I was met with tonal words I couldn't ignore. I needed to go to seminary.

It was then I opted to finally and fully listen to our Lord's call for me. I decided that if God ever wanted me to leave, I'd get the same kick in the pants to get out. Luckily, and gracefully, during my time in seminary, my joy in our faith, and love in and for the Lord, continued to grow, until I was willfully and happily singing along to the song of our Lord.

Just as I'll sing along to the J-Pop from my animes (Judge not lest ye be judged!)

Every day, the Lord is singing to us. He's singing the song of His love and invites us to sing along with Him. Yet all too often we choose to ignore Him, or try to exorcise His song from our minds, or we don't take the time to truly stop and listen to what He's saying, what song He's singing. Yet it's His song and His will for us that brings us the greatest of joys and leads us to the promised eternity in Heaven. Our God who is Creator of All wants us to be as happy as we can be, to love Him and others as best we can, and to help the world do the same. Being all-knowing and all-loving, He knows the path that will best lead us to do just this!

So let's seek each day to place God first in our lives, strive to give our Lord the time and love He deserves, listen to His song, so that we too may willfully and happily sing along to the song of our Lord, the song of love.





NEW DVDs


