From The Pastor's Pen

As I mentioned, at some Masses last weekend, while I have always been appreciative of your love, support and prayers, I am particularly grateful for your love, support and prayers over the last several weeks.

We celebrate today, our patroness, St. Therese of Lisieux. We think of a sweet, non-threatening, beautiful young woman. But one writer has described her differently. He calls her dangerous, the most dangerous of saints.

The same author insists that she is dangerous to those content with being spiritually mediocre and that she's a threat to every soul that does not aspire to holiness. Instead, she takes away every excuse we can come up with insisting that the love with which we do something is greater than what we do. That means even the smallest, insignificant action, done for love of God, even picking a pin up off the floor, can be a way of growing in holiness. She teaches that if we're not growing in holiness, it's because we're not trying. She realizes that each day, every one of us receives many opportunities to grow in holiness. It may involve being patient with someone in a difficult moment, it may be speaking kindly when we're tempted to gossip, it may involve showing courtesy when we're in traffic or thousands of others little but very real ways.

St. Therese shows us how to grow in holiness through the events of daily life, in every little way. But she also shows us how to grow in holiness in the midst of suffering. For about the last seventeen months of her life, she suffered from tuberculosis. In addition to what was excruciating pain, for which she refused morphine, she was subjected to some absolutely brutal medical practices.

People were amazed that she lived as long as she did and she said she didn't think it was possible to suffer so much. She said, I offer up these very great pains to obtain the light of faith for poor unbelievers, for all those who separate themselves from the Church's beliefs.

And then, if all that wasn't enough, this final period of her life was marked by a pitch black spiritual darkness where she prayed and yet felt nothing and found herself wondering if there was heaven and yet in the midst of all this, with characteristic determination, she persevered. She said she would eat this

bread of sorrow for as long as God willed it and saw it as a way of praying for those who had no faith and of sharing in the suffering of those who don't believe. She added that although she did not have the joy of faith, she continued to do the work of faith.



The darkness did not break until literally the very last moment of her life. Her childlike trust saw her through a very adult trial and a deep sharing in the sufferings of Christ. Even in the darkness, she persevered with a life of very intentional faith. In all this she teaches us to beware of mediocrity, to realize the gift each present moment and to preserve.

To us as a parish and as individuals, may St. Therese always inspire us with her example, give us a model to imitate according to our state in life and assist us with her prayers. St. Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, pray for us and pray for our parish.

The last couple of years have been a very challenging time for the Church in the United States as we continue to confront the mishandling of sexual abuse cases. This is something that everyone finds disturbing but for some people it can move beyond disturbing to the point where it may even shake their faith.

Bishop Robert Barron is an auxiliary bishop in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and prior to that he was a priest in Chicago where he was also one of my professors. Bishop Barron has recently written a brief work entitled, *Letter to a Suffering Church* in which he explores some of the pain so many of us have been feeling. It is a short and easily readable book.

This weekend we have a second collection but it will be a reverse collection. Baskets will be passed but rather than put something in, we are asking you take something out. Copies of *Letter to a Suffering Church* will be in the baskets. Please take one and read it. If you know of someone who you think might benefit from reading it, please take one for that person as well.

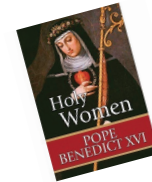

Do you know how St. Thérèse became known as the "Little Flower"?



St. Thérèse loved nature, and often used the imagery of nature to explain how the Divine Presence is everywhere, and how everything is connected in God's

loving care and arms. Thérèse saw herself as "the Little Flower of Jesus" because she was just like the simple wild flowers in forests and fields, unnoticed by the greater population, yet growing and giving glory to God. Thérèse did not see herself as a brilliant rose or an elegant lily, but simply as a small wild flower. This is how she understood herself before the Lord – simple and hidden, but blooming where God had painted her.

October 19, 1997 Pope John Paul II proclaimed St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face Doctor of the Church...
