From The Pope's Pulpit and The Pastor's Pen

Bullying is a phenomenon of self-compensation, self-assessment, not of finding myself, but of decreasing the other to feel better. It means learning to look from top to bottom, and badly.

Do not forget that it is only legitimate for one person to look at another downwards, from above, do you know when? When helping them to get up. Any other way of looking from above downwards is not legitimate.

And when it occurs in youth groups, in schools, in neighborhoods, wherever, in these expressions of aggression, bullying, you see the poverty of the identity of the person who attacks, who needs to attack in order to feel that he or she is a person.

On Monday we started the new fiscal year. Eventually, we will post the numbers for last year and the budget for our coming year. Each year expenses go up. This includes the modest salary increase to all our dedicated but modestly paid employees. To stay ahead, it is important that our revenue continues to increase as well.

Many tremendous things happen at this parish due to the generosity of our people. As I often say, what the Eucharist is to the spiritual life of our parish, regular, generous giving is to our financial life. Nothing takes the place of the Eucharist and nothing takes the place of regular, generous giving. My thanks to all who support our parish in so many ways.

Often when leaving the Parish Office, I see the Adoration Chapel and am reminded that in the midst of the many fine activities of our parish, there are those supporting all of us with their prayers before the Blessed Sacrament. This program has been going here at St. Therese since 1999.

Eucharistic adoration takes place Monday through Thursday from 9:00 A.M. to 11:00 P.M.; on Fridays from 9:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M.; and on Saturdays from 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. We want to have at least two people present at all times. A list of slots where we especially need help are on page 4 of this bulletin. Please consider spending an hour in adoration each week.

We also encourage people to stop by the Adoration Chapel and make a brief visit when possible. Consider bringing your children as well. I fondly remember the times my parents would take me and my brother for such brief visits when I was young.

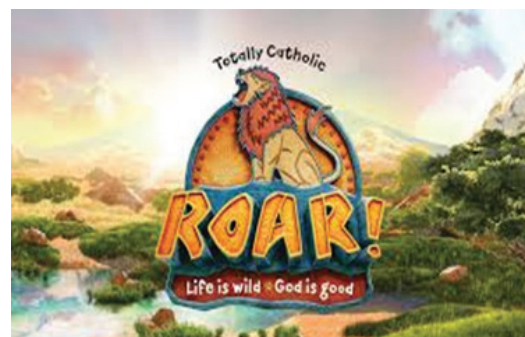

--a little boys astounding story of his trip to Heaven and back...

Heaven is for Real

By Todd Burpo

When Colton Burpo made it through an emergency appendectomy, his family was overjoyed at his miraculous survival.

What they weren't expecting, though, was the story that emerged in the months that followed—a story as beautiful as it was extraordinary, detailing their little boy's trip to heaven and back.

Colton, not yet four years old, told his parents he left his body during the surgery—and authenticated that claim by describing exactly what his parents were doing in another part of the hospital while he was being operated on. He talked of visiting heaven and relayed stories told to him by people he met there whom he had never met in life, sharing events that happened even before he was born. He also astonished his parents with descriptions and obscure details about heaven that matched the Bible exactly, though he had not yet learned to read.

With disarming innocence and the plain-spoken boldness of a child, Colton tells of meeting long-departed family members. He describes Jesus, the angels, how “really, really big” God is, and how much God loves us. Retold by his father, but using Colton's uniquely simple words, *Heaven is for Real* offers a glimpse of the world that awaits us, whereas Colton says, “Nobody is old and nobody wears glasses.”

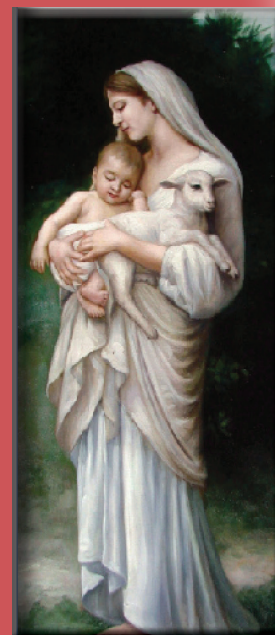
